## How to Read Guitar Tab.

These lines represent the 6 strings of the guitar E A D G B E.


The numbers on the lines represent the fret on which you place your finger.

If there is a " 0 " that means no fingers on that string. That's an "open string"

Whichever fret you play, use that same finger number. For example, you use your $1^{\text {st }}$ finger on the $1^{\text {st }}$ fret, your $2^{\text {nd }}$ finger on the $2^{\text {nd }}$ fret and your $3^{\text {rd }}$ finger on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ fret.

In this example, the first note you play is the open $G$ string (or open $3^{\text {rd }}$ string). You play it twice because there are two 0's

The next two notes, you put your finger on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ fret, of the $B$ string ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ string)

The next two notes are on the open E string ( $1^{\text {st }}$ string), played twice, because there are two 0 's

And the last note is played, as before, on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ fret, of the $B$ string ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ string)
